



Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reporting 2019

The release of Greenhouse Gases ("GHG") notably carbon dioxide ("CO₂") generated by burning fossil fuels, has an impact on climate change which, either directly or indirectly, represents considerable risks both to the business and the planet. The Group is committed to monitoring and, where practicably possible, reducing its GHG emissions.

The report has been created using the following scopes:

Scope 1 – All Direct Emissions from the activities of an organisation or under their control. Including fuel combustion on site such as gas boilers, fleet vehicles and air-conditioning leaks.

Scope 2 – Indirect Emissions from electricity purchased and used by the organisation. Emissions are created during the production of the energy and eventually used by the organisation.

Scope 3 – All Other Indirect Emissions from activities of the organisation, occurring from sources that they do not own or control. These are usually the greatest share of the carbon footprint, covering emissions associated with business travel, procurement, waste and water.

Methodology: DWF utilise a third part system (Accuvio) in which a record of energy, travel etc. are recorded on a monthly basis. To date, records have only been kept for the UK and international travel. Therefore, assumptions have been made on headcount and the TPPPY produced for the UK to include international travel. Some international offices are serviced offices and electricity consumption is not broken down per tenant or indeed per floor. Assumptions have also been based on: 2017 data included UK commuting figures. Where reporting 2017/18 commuting will be included in the first few months only (Jan to April). Scope 3 has been included on a voluntary basis. Whilst energy figures have decreased, there has been an increase in international travel which was expected with the growth of the business

The report to be submitted in 2020: The analysis will use an operational control approach. This means that certain sites which have a service agreement for utilities will not be included in the report.
